

FREESTYLE POLICY

Dear Parents, Coaches, and Skaters:

In an effort to make your Freestyle skating experience at Prince William Ice Center safe, positive and productive, we have adopted the following policies. Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with them.

SCHEDULES AND PAYMENT POLICIES

Freestyle Sessions are 1 hour in duration. Current schedules are available in the lobby. Schedules are subject to change, so please check our website for the most up-to-date schedule.

Freestyle tickets must be purchased from the front desk personnel using debit card or other form of payment before a skater enters the ice. A skater or parent must sign the freestyle log before a skater enters the ice. This includes morning sessions. Sessions skated without sufficient funds will be charged to the skaters debit card at the drop in rate. There is a \$50 minimum when placing funds on your debit card.

Only skaters who are registered for Intense Ice are allowed to enter or leave the ice between sessions.

MUSIC AND PROGRAMS

Music should be turned in to the Freestyle Monitor at the beginning of the session at which you are skating. Music will be placed in line and played at the skater's or coach's request on a first come – first served basis, with those taking scheduled lessons having priority to accommodate the lesson schedule.

It is the skater's or coach's responsibility to be aware of their position in the music line up. If a skater does not wish their music to be played, please ask the Freestyle Monitor to skip your music and place it in the back of the line or remove it from the lineup altogether. Restarting of music will occur at the discretion of the Freestyle Monitor. Music will not be started at the last minute of a session before a scheduled ice cut.

"Bumping" of skaters who are not in a lesson can only occur once during a freestyle session. It is the "bumping" coach's responsibility to inform the bumped skater of the change. The Freestyle Monitor will inform the coaches when skaters have already been bumped once.



Intense Ice Program

Skaters practicing their programs have right of way on the ice and every skater must follow this rule. Occasionally interruptions in program or lesson flow, near misses, or even crashes may occur. Skaters and coaches must maintain an air of professionalism toward fellow coaches and skaters at all times.

Our number one concern and priority is the safety of all freestyle participants.
